



• The fortified site of Zaldapa was founded in the second quarter of the fourth century during the extensive campaign of fortifications a *fundamentis* in the province of Scythia Minor, which was little urbanized outside the coastal line. The military strengthening had begun towards the end of the third century after the Goths' invasions as a preventive measure against future Barbarian attacks. With its 25 ha intra-muros territory and at least two outside quaters Zaldapa is the biggest one in the hinterland of the Lower Danubian provinces.
















Plan of Zaldapa according to Škorpil's publication






Plan of Zaldapa according to Torbatov (2000)



Plan of Zaldapa – international mission (adapted by B. M'Barek)


The northern sector 2017

- Area selected to be excavated by the international mission – the northern sector where appear gaps on the urban fabric, including the NE main gate (1) and the nearby basilica (2).
- In 2021 and 2022 this zone was enlarged including the postern and the covered passage leading to the cistern down hill (3) and the tetraconch church (4) in South direction.






